I often pair the text for this class with Knowles, T. & Brown, D. (2000). *What every middle school teacher should know*. Westerville, OH: AMLE and Bishop, D. & Harrison, L. (2021). *The Successful Middle School: This We Believe*. Westerville, Ohio: AMLE Knowles. These additional texts are used throughout the middle level program and ground our coursework in the AMLE standards. I would need to use additional articles, podcasts, and blogs to teach about educational research and management models. I often use Cult of Pedagogy for current best practices.

What are the strengths of this book? (Think: writing style, citations, currency, diagrams etc..) The list of additional readings, videos, and tutorials is a nice addition. The book does a great job at explaining the Bioecological Model of Human Development, which our current text does not do well.

What are the weaknesses of this book?

The way it breaks up some of the educational theories can make it a bit difficult to compare and contrast. The text is also very text-heavy and dense. It may be a challenge to get students to actually read it. To be able to use this book – what will you have to supplement?

I would need to supplement the way the material relates to young adolescents--but I have to do that anyway.

Compared to your previous purchased book – is the effort required to use this OER worth it \_ why or why not?

No. I just think the density of the book in terms of text and visuals would not appeal to our current undergraduate students. I do think I will capitalize on the lists of videos and tutorials, but I do not think the students would enjoy the format.

If you were to use this book, would you also use a homework system? If yes, which one would you use (LibreTexts and Lumen learning are some examples)

We use Blackboard as our learning management system and I already post assignments there. Most assignments are application based within their field experience. That would not change no matter which text we use.
